**Re: Courtesy notice regarding pro se *quo warranto* filing delivered to Supreme Court**

Mark Brnovich;

With this letter 20 Arizona citizens, Petitioners pro se, make known to you our *quo warranto* filing and petition for review delivered today to the Supreme Court of Arizona. Petitioners in the complaint do understand Arizona statute with regards to filing this writ, and the function of your office as to typically bringing the *quo warranto* writ before the court on behalf of citizens and the state.

In our filing, we have made assertions that we believe make it unfitting to bring this to you, for your office to file on our behalf, as it asserts widespread usurpation across our state that includes elections from 2018 until now. This, by implication, would include you on the list of inadvertent usurpers, although you are not a named respondent in our filing. We do not wish the process slowed in any way and proceed in an emergent fashion due to the nature of the facts. As well, we choose to avoid putting your office in any situation that may be a conflict of interest.

We would wish it to be different and to have a chance for representation by an officer of our state to help us navigate the court and the details of filing. We, however, have boldly stepped forward to bring what we believe to be a fully researched and viable complaint, on our own, pursuant to precedent and common law.
